## Term -Time Leave of Absence

Changes in the law mean that head teachers can no longer grant leave of absence in term -time unless there are exceptional circumstances for the absence.
The following reasons are NOT considered as exceptional:

Holidays taken in term time due to lower costs, parental work commitments or once in a life time experiences.
Holidays abroad for the purpose of visiting a sick relative
Holidays booked as a surprise by relatives


## Attendance Matters

Children who attend school every day make better progress

The Education Act of 1996 states that it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to ensure that all children between the ages of 5-16 years attend school on a regular basis AND on time. Failure to do this may end up with YOU being fined and taken to court.

- 1 day EVERY week
- 6 days EVERY half term
- 12 days EVERY term
- 36 days EVERY year
- 180 days in five years. . . . . .

That's nearly ONE WHOLE SCHOOL YEAR!

If a child has 10 days off school in a school year, they're actually spending more days at home than at school.
