We believe that marking and feedback, when used in a way that is meaningful to pupils, helps raise standards. Marking and feedback (written and verbal) provides a formative assessment process for teachers that will inform lesson planning. Our approach to marking and feedback across the school provides clear opportunities to re-visit work (where appropriate) and identify appropriate next steps.

We believe that marking and feedback is an integral part of the learning process and supports children as they move through the education system. By developing the skills of editing and improving their work, alongside learning to recognise their successes and to identify their next steps, pupils are better equipped for many aspects of learning throughout their longer-term educational experiences. At Brill, we directly teach the children to identify their next steps in the context of the learning objective being taught in any lesson; support is given with this when appropriate. We also provide opportunities for children to mark their own work within some lessons so that they receive immediate feedback and then can use the final part of the lesson to make improvements or to move onto a new level of challenge.

This approach, which uses self-assessment, combined with opportunities for peer-to-peer assessment where appropriate, alongside verbal feedback given within the context of the lesson have been evidenced by many to have a greater impact upon children's learning and outcomes. This positively affects the learning experiences of the children.

Marking Codes for KS1 and KS2

Within Brill, we use one marking code for EYFS and KS1 and another for KS2 to support the children in understanding what particular annotations in their books mean. These are shown below.
